

Here are the Pastors' Picks from Pastor Nick and Pastor Katherine for September 22. The great books just keep coming. Come see them.

#### Mere Christianity by CS Lewis (Pastor Katherine)

CS Lewis can be infuriating, but this book always makes me want to become a Christian all over again. It contains Lewis's famous contention about Jesus: "I am trying here to prevent anyone saying the really foolish thing that people often say about Him: I'm ready to accept Jesus as a great moral teacher, but I don't accept his claim to be God. That is the one thing we must not say. A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic — on the level with the man who says he is a poached egg — or else he would be the Devil of Hell. You must make your choice. Either this man was, and is, the Son of God, or else a madman or something worse. You can shut him up for a fool, you can spit at him and kill him as a demon or you can fall at his feet and call him Lord and God but let us not come with any patronizing nonsense about his being a great human teacher. He has not left that open to us. He did not intend to."

#### Daring Greatly by Brene Brown (Pastor Nick)

I pretty much love anything Brene Brown but this book has substantially influenced the leadership I have chosen to model to our church. In a world where vulnerability can be seen as weakness and leadership requires the appearance of "strength", I found Brene's insights into the human condition especially poignant navigating our transitions and choosing to remain open to new roles and new relationship. This book is also a favorite of my wife Amanda!

#### The Cross and the Lynching Tree by James H. Cone (Pastor Katherine)

James H. Cone was one of the foremost Black liberation theologians, and this book is his most searing and accessible work of constructive theology. The lines he draws between the suffering of Jesus on the cross and the suffering of Black people on lynching trees are indelible. I will never be able to consider one without the other again. **Our Newest Mission Partner**: Henderson Settlement is located in Frakes, KY - the poorest county in Kentucky. Volunteer work teams and individuals come together to repair the homes of the residents in this Kentucky/Tennessee area. Volunteers select the repair projects, raise the money, and complete the projects within their abilities. Home repairs can range from building a ramp, replacing windows, doors, and siding, installing new kitchen cabinets, or installing metal roofing. People who prefer to stay on campus find volunteer opportunities in the thrift store, helping with the infant and young mother program, food pantry, and senior program. Volunteers are vital to the ministry Henderson Settlement is able to provide to area residents. How can you help our newest mission partner?


